


3rd General Parent Meeting May 5, 2021 ZOOM MEETING





- **JAT Cancelled -** As this fundraising effort was already budgeted for, but canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic we replaced it with the EFG Campaign. We are allowing families to purchase Scrip to fulfill any outstanding fundraising obligations. Families will have until May 17, 2021 to complete this obligation, as we extended the deadline for Scrip purchases.

- EFG Campaign: Water Bottle Filling Stations, new curriculum next year, no tuition increase this year (but will do so each year after this).
- Gently used uniform donations accepted in office through 5/10 (Clean with new logos only, please)
- Gently Used Uniform Sale: May 18-20 Before and after school
- DCS reported that according to an internal survey, I00% of our high schools and 94% of all ADLA elementary schools plan to fully reopen in person instruction in the fall, barring CDC guidelines (hybrid may be an option, but not distance learning)
- Additionally, I 00% of faculty and staff in elementary and high schools have been given the opportunity to be vaccinated.
- Please anticipate follow up communication regarding COVID-19 testing resources, vaccinations for ages 12 and up (pending FDA approval) and status for next school year.
- If a child is sick, do not send them to school. Take an actual sick day, do not allow the child work from home so they can recover.

Great News!: Tuition updates

- No tuition increase for this year: most schools raise tuition every year. We have kept it the same for the past few years, but we MUST raise it next year and every year after that to be sustainable. Minimum wage is \$15/hr
- Sponsors and Donors

- LAUSD: gets \$12,000 to educate one child each year

CEF Zoom appointments were done on April 9, 2021. If the family did not attend the appointment then paperwork needs to be submitted to the school ASAP.

Scrip Sales end May 17, 2021 (extension due to NO Fiesta), and will open back up on July 1, 2021. If they purchase any Scrip between **May 18-June 30**, **credit will go to the school**.

Service Hours will be due May 28, 2021, and invoiced June 1, 2021.

All 8th-grade fees must all be paid by June 4, 2021, in order to avoid graduation holds.

All K-7th grade fees must be paid by June 11, 2021, in order to avoid report card holds



The last time we went through this process was in 2014. We got the maximum 6-year accreditation. We hope to do the same this time around. I am so proud of all our students, parents, faculty, and staff here at St. Anthony! You can view our final Self-Study online.



Safety Reminders

- Thank you for **driving safely and wearing your face coverings any time you are on campus** (5MPH on campus) We are limiting the amount of visitors at this time. Please abide by the Social Distancing signs. Office hours are M-F 8am-4pm **by appt only**. **5 people total** in office at a time.
