

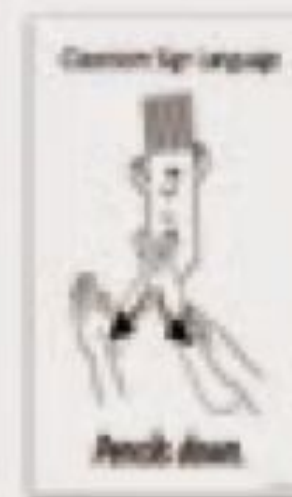

SAFETY AND LOGISTICS

- **Emergency cards:** please update all information at front office should anything change (name, address, telephone number, custody issues)
- Most important: yellow emergency card. **Children will ONLY be released to those on this card.**
- **Routine emergency drills** (once a month) for earthquake, lockdown, fire
- All **medical diagnoses/special needs must reported to the office** and teachers to assist during school hours. Any allergies? Be specific please. Medication can be labeled and left in office, update it after expiration date.
- Your child is **sick or absent**? Call or email office. **BE ON TIME**...or it affects Work Habits grade, you will be fined for excessive tardies. See truancy policy in handbook for attendance policy (under Parents Tab online). Attendance register is a legal document
- **Vaccinations are highly encouraged for all eligible children ages 12-15:** before Fall (summer gatherings), used to be only for ages 16 and over, we plan to **FULLY REOPEN in the fall for 5 days a week in-person learning.**

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

- **One Entrance:** Berendo St. (small parking lot: park and walk using crosswalks for Kinder and 1st grade families, drop off and pick up at classroom) or park on 163rd to walk students in and out.
- **One Exit:** on 161st Street
- Be courteous please! SLOW DOWN! **5MPH**
- Inform **relatives and friends** of our procedure if they are to drop off or pick up your child
- Get involved! This year is what you make of it for your child. Volunteer for Yard Duty to earn service hours (must be **Virtus-trained and ADLA Fingerprinted** and cleared)

- **7:30am:** NO Morning Daycare, teachers on duty starting at 7:30am
- **7:30am-7:45am:** Drop off (K-1st grade - Park car in designated areas and walk your child to their classroom. Please use Crosswalks!)
- **7:50am: 1st bell (tardy):** - Morning assembly & prayer by St. Jude Statue

TUITION FEES

- One of the **most affordable tuition rates** in the South Bay while offering the latest and greatest in terms of technology and services. Small tuition increase each year.
- **FACTS TUITION** is required of all families. (\$50 annual fee)
- **8hrs of service required at the Fiesta in May:** oldest and largest festival in the South Bay. Different from the 30 service hours (you will be billed after each trimester if you have not done **10 service hours per trimester**. There are many ways to do this!)
- All parents required to serve on a **parent committee/PLC** (choose up to 4 depending on interest: community building opportunity)
- **30 Mandatory Service Hours to benefit the whole school (OPTION TO BUY OUT)** will go up to \$15/hour next school year

SCRIP INFO

Interested in learning how the Scrip Program works? Want to learn how to earn money towards your financial commitment with every day shopping?

We encourage you to set up your account prior to the Scrip 101 meeting. We will walk you through how to use Shop With Scrip. There is no cost to sign up. Follow the steps below:

- 1) Go to www.shopwithscrip.com and click "Sign in".
- 2) Don't have an account yet? Click "Get Started".
- 3) Would you Like to Join Your Group's Existing Program? Click "Join a Scrip Program".
- 4) Enter the St. Anthony of Padua School Enrollment Code: **3EE95DEC68L6**
- 5) Continue to follow the 5 steps a create a new account. (user name, password, name, address, student, email, security questions)
- 6) Register your cell phone, and a 6-digit code will be sent to you immediately.
- 7) Verify your account by entering the code.
- 8) Part one of Registration is now complete. Part two involves creating a "Presto Pay account" which will allow you to purchase scrip from home computers and mobile devices for immediate use.
- 9) Return to the home page. Go to Dashboard> Family Functions> Presto Pay
- 10) Read the agreement and scroll down to accept agreement by clicking on "Yes and I agree".
- 11) Next screen is where bank account info (checking or savings account) and personal info is entered.
- 12) A screen will appear explaining that 2 random amounts will be deposited into the bank account you indicated in two business days. You need to return to the website and enter the two amounts. You will receive an approval code via email. This code is what you forward to Mr. Carlos Aguilar, the school's financial secretary, to start receiving proper credit for your family.

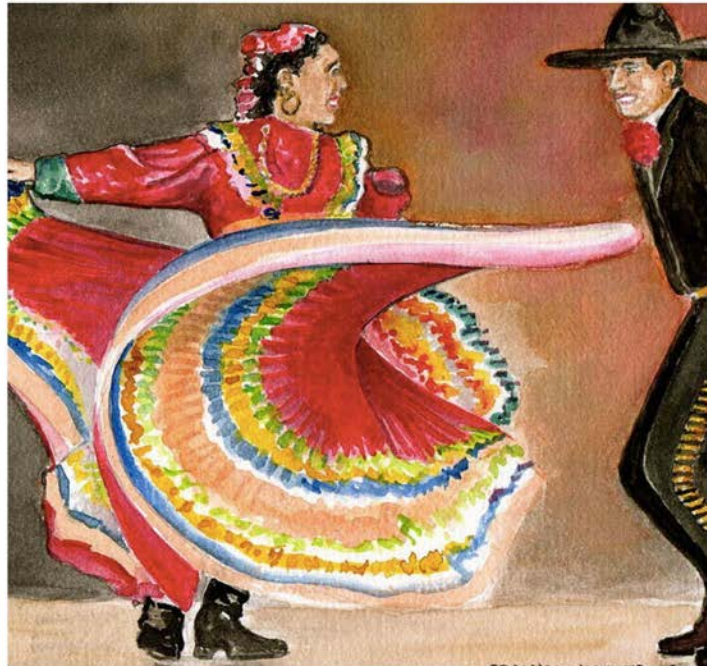

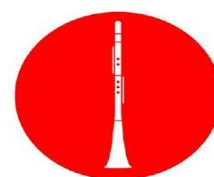

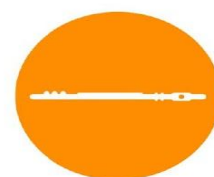

SUMMER READING ASSIGNMENT

1. Read at least 10 books.
Students entering Kindergarten in the Fall are required to read a total of 10 books over the summer. Children may read these books themselves if they have the ability to do so or their parents may read the books to them.

2. Do a Book Report
Of the 10 books read, students can choose 5 books to draw a picture demonstrating their understanding of the story. Drawings for any additional books are optional. Copy the picture form as necessary.

3. Fill out Book log
Parents are asked to assist their child in keeping a log of the books read. A form for this purpose is attached. A parent's signature is required acknowledging that the student has read each of the books listed. Students should bring their drawings along with their list of books read to their classroom teacher on the first day of school.



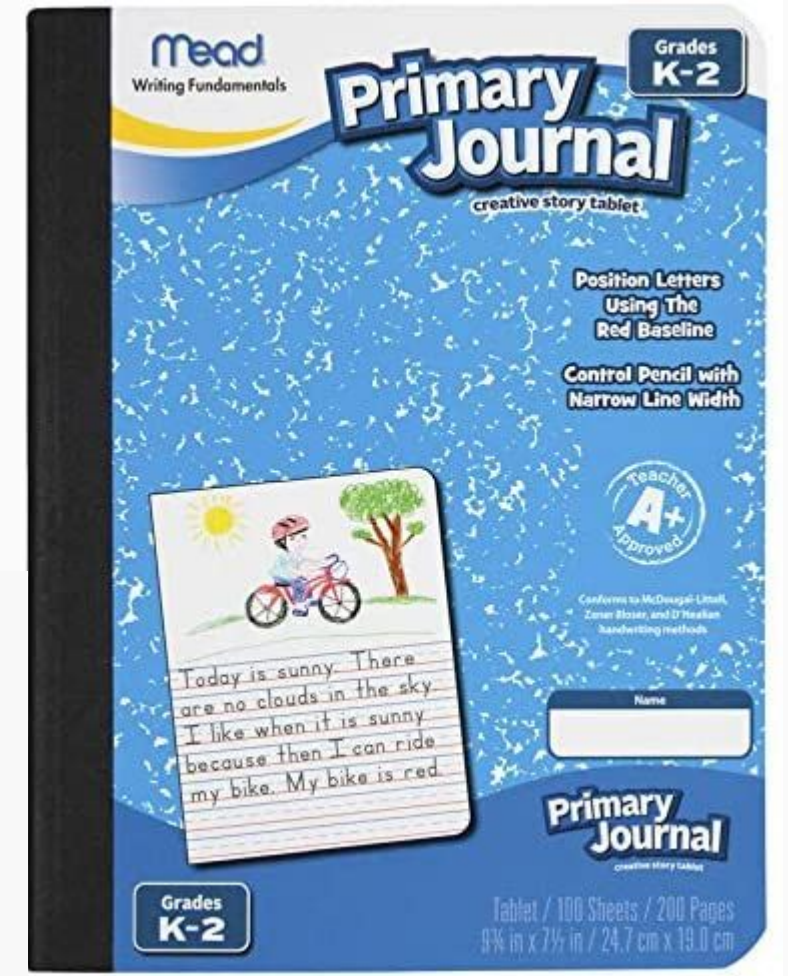

In its 8 years of service, CPLA counselors have provided almost 100,000 counseling sessions to over 10,000 students.

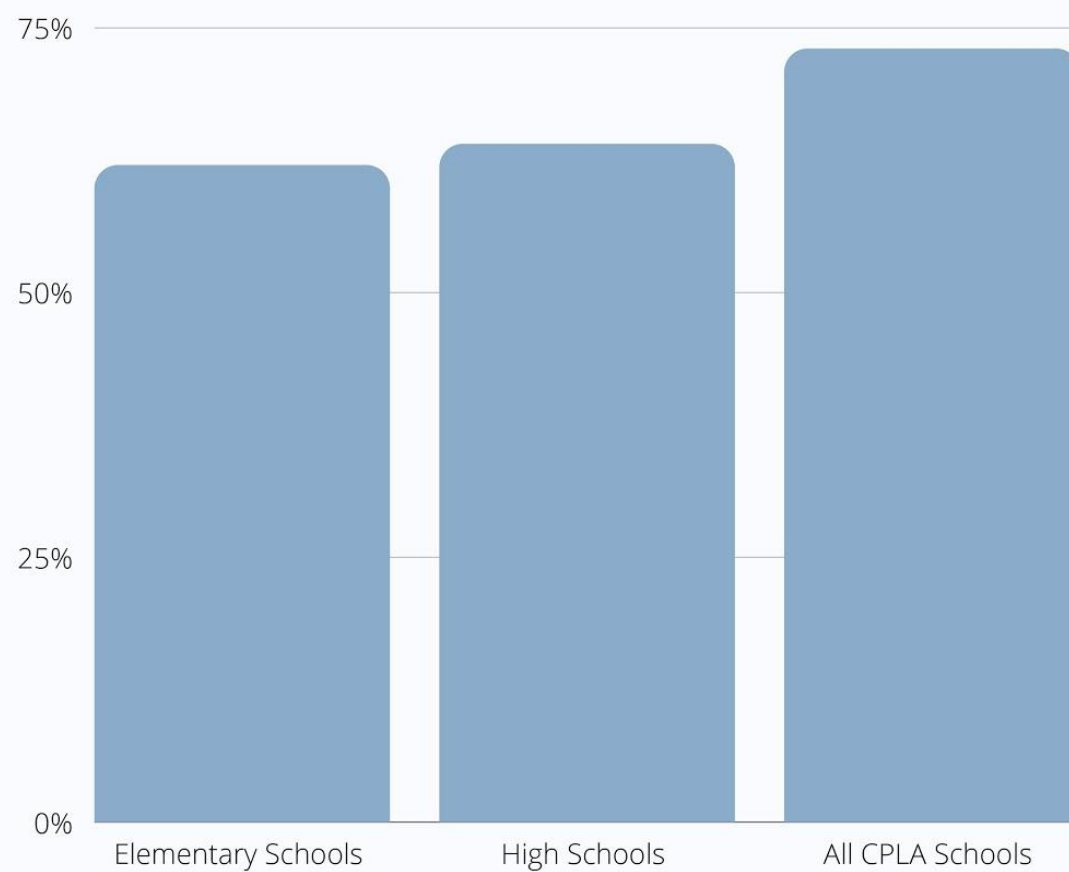

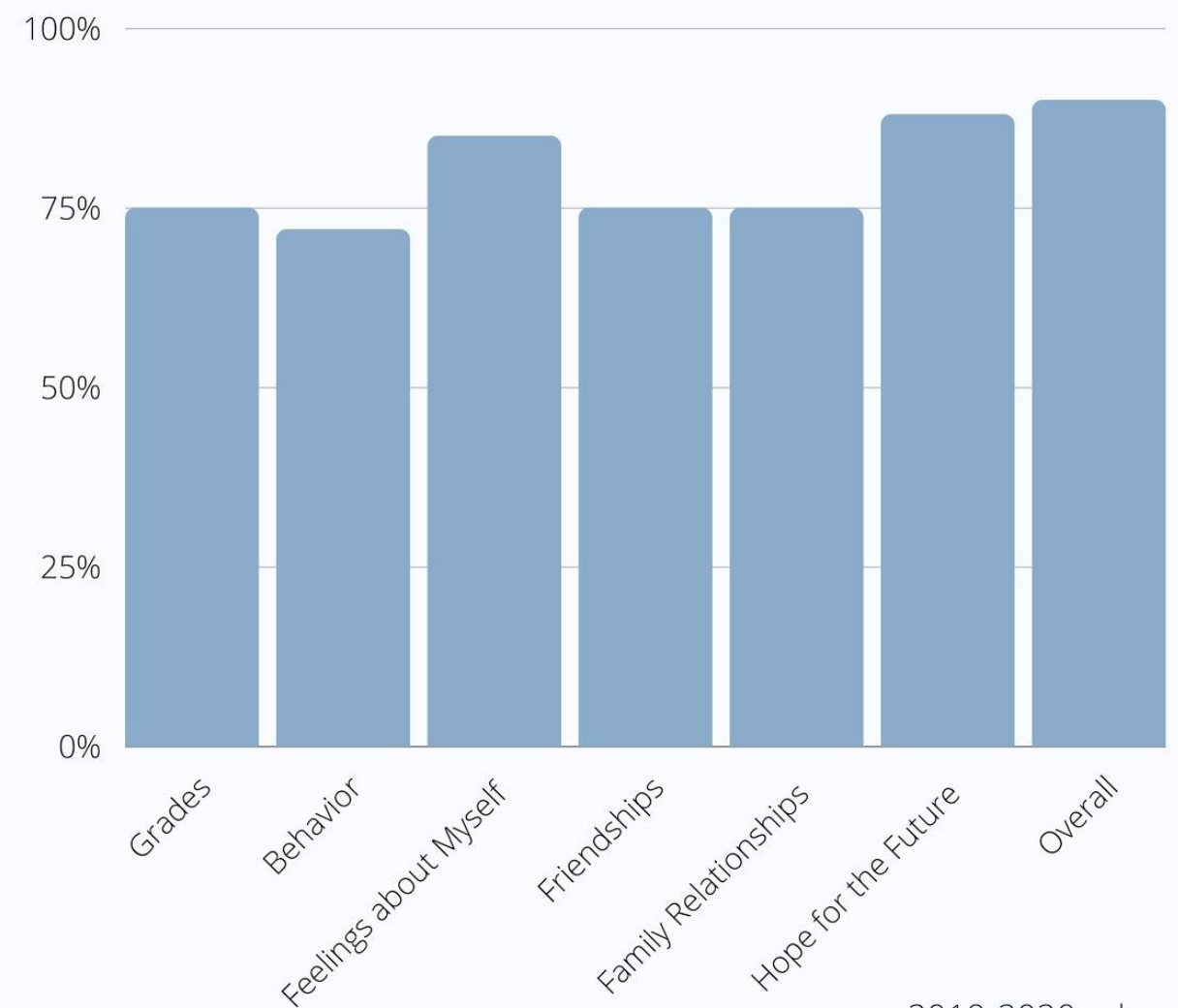

Student Self-Evaluation



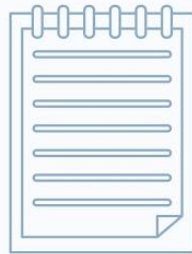
