### Eternal Father,










## **UPDATES**

### Fundraising Financial Commitment

To keep tuition costs low, all families have a \$500 fundraising requirement per family. \*This can be rolled into your FACTS tuition payments to avoid fundraising, or be paid in advance. Each family has the following financial commitment of \$500 per family.
