
Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on us.





CHRISTIAN CODE OF CONDUCT Parents, Guardians and Students

The students' interest in receiving a quality, morally based education can best be served if students, parents and school officials work together. Normally, differences between these individuals can be resolved. In some rare instances, however, the school may find it necessary, in its discretion, to require parents or guardians to withdraw their children.

It shall be an express condition of enrollment that the students and parents or guardians shall conform themselves to standards of conduct that are consistent with the Christian principles of the school, as determined by the school in its discretion. These principles include, but are not limited to, any policies or procedures set forth in any student/parent handbook of the school. These Christian principles further include, but are not limited to, the following:

Parents or guardians are expected to work courteously and cooperatively with the school to assist the student in meeting the academic, moral, and behavioral expectations of the school. Bullying at ANY level, among parents, students, faculty, and staff is unacceptable. It has no place in a Catholic school, and will be dealt with accordingly in a swift manner.

Students and parents or guardians may **respectfully** express their concerns about the school operation and its personnel. However, they may not do so in a manner that is discourteous, scandalous, rumor driven, disruptive, threatening, hostile or divisive.

Any parent or guardian or other person whose conduct, in a place where a school employee is required to be in the course of his or her duties, materially disrupts classwork or extracurricular activities or involves substantial disorder is guilty of a misdemeanor. This statement does not apply to any otherwise lawful employee concerted activity, including but not limited to, picketing and the distribution of handbills.

Any parent or guardian, student, or other person who insults or abuses the principal or any teacher in the presence of other school personnel, students, or parents and at a place—which is on school premises or public sidewalks, streets, or other public ways, adjacent to school premises or at some other place, where the principal or teacher is required to be at, such other place in connection with assigned school activities—risks the continuation of his or her child in the school. These expectations for students and parents or guardians include, but are not limited to, all school-sponsored programs and events (e.g., extended care, athletics, field trips, etc.). This includes negative postings about the school, faculty, staff, or administration on Social media. Such action will result in a warning and may lead to dismissal. The school reserves the right to determine, in its discretion, when conduct is of such a severe nature as to warrant immediate action without warning.







UPDATES

- Slight TUITION increase for next school year to keep up with minimum wage: most schools raise tuition every year. At SAP you get the most bang for your buck! Feds are telling us that inflation is at 8%, could be more. Other schools are raising it up to 10% next year.
- We rely on Generous Sponsors and Donors to help us keep our tuition low, so it's very affordable and we
 offer financial aide (CEF, NEI, in-house tuition aid if you qualify)
- Minimum wage \$15.50/hr, almost \$16/hour in some LA locations. Daycare is \$15/day and service hours are \$15/hr. May go up to \$16 next school year. 10 service hours per trimester to hit 30 for the family per year
- PLCs are so important! We save money this way (sign up today based on interest and skill level) Interior Maintenance PLC, Lunch Yard Duty, traffic duty (sign up in back of the hall to become a PLC member or lead a committee next year) We invite all families to leadership. The year is what we make of it for our kids!
- Parent involvement and partnership: kids love seeing you! Thanks to all our PLC leads!
- Please note the School Office is open 7:30am-4:00pm. Monday through Friday
 Administration and Faculty will do their best to answer your emails and return phone calls within 24 hrs.

If we are not able to reach you on a Friday, or a holiday/weekend we will contact you the next school day. Please be mindful of family life AFTER school hours for our teachers and administrators. Work life balance and self-care is important for all our faculty and staff.



- K-8 PLC fund:- \$50 per family for events and supplies that benefit the entire school; not just one class
- 6th-8th Junior High Fee: \$40 per student
- 6th- Locker Fee/Replacement: \$10 per student
- a 8th gr. Graduation Fee: \$150 (8th grade only) Students will not graduate /receive diplomas until balances are paid in full.
- ☐ Kinder Promotion Fee: \$20 per student (Kinder only)
- ☐ Sports Fee: \$50 per sport per student (if applicable)
- Theater Fee: \$50 per student (if applicable)
- Note there is a FACTS returned payment fee of \$30 and a School late fee payment of \$25 totaling \$55 per returned check.
- If your account has an <u>outstanding balance</u> at the end of the year, your child will not be able to start the new school year until it is settled. If you leave the school without paying what you owe, it may be sent to a collection agency.
- If families disclose information about the school aid they are receiving they may lose their tuition assistance. Confidentiality is of utmost importance.

Saint Anthony of Padua School receives no funding from the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and/or outside entities. The school relies solely on tuition and fundraising to meet all costs involved in maintaining academics for our students as well as a balanced budget. Payments of tuition and fees for the full school year are the parents' guardians' obligation and responsibility. Please refer to the Parent/Student Handbook for additional information. If a student leaves or transfers out of school prior to completion of the contract, the parent/guardian may be responsible for paying the remaining balance. Unpaid, outstanding balances may be sent to a collection agency.


